

Katherine Terrace/ Lindsay Street Intersection Safety Improvements

Improving motorist and pedestrian safety

The Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics is planning to deliver a vital road safety project within the Township of Katherine.

Following safety concerns raised by the community and multiple incidents at the intersection of the Stuart Highway (Katherine Terrace) and Lindsay Street/ Railway Terrace, a road safety audit was conducted and upgrades have been identified to improve the safety of this intersection.

The intersection is a key access road to Katherine's central business district. Lindsay Street/ Railway Terrace makes a cross road with the Katherine Terrace which is a busy dual lane Highway; Lindsay Street hosts two way traffic yet Railway Terrace is restricted to one way traffic entering only.

Consultation commences on Monday 10 December 2018 on proposed works which include:

- Eliminating movements through the centre of the intersection by extending and landscaping the median break;
- widening the kerbside to reduce the distance for pedestrians crossing at the intersection;
- upgrade the current "Give Way" sign at Lindsay Street to a "Stop" sign;
- refresh line marking; and
- relocate the existing bus parking facility on Katherine Terrace.

Residents and businesses in Katherine and those who utilise the intersection are invited to provide feedback on these proposed works to the Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics by emailed to roadskatherine.ntg@nt.gov.au

Feedback will be taken into account in finalising design, works are expected to commence in early 2019.

Consultation closes on 25 January 2019
